## Our Mission







Ethnicity




## 2015–16 Re-enrollment Rate

Did not Re-enroll




## 2015–16 Teacher Retention Rate

## 2015–16 Average National Learning Gains


(1.0 is considered the national norm for growth in one school year)

## Imagine Schools Wins 41 Promising Practices Awards in 2016

Character.org recognized Imagine Schools' acclaimed character education approach with 41 Promising Practices awards at 33 of their 60 campuses nationally. This builds on previous awards from Character.org, including recognition as a National District of Character in 2013.
